## SLEEP WORKSHOP

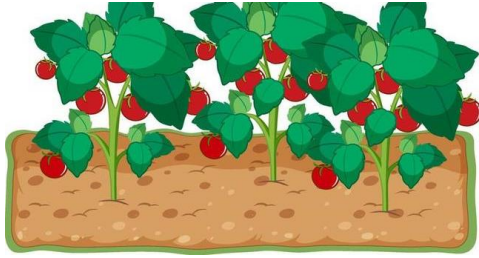
